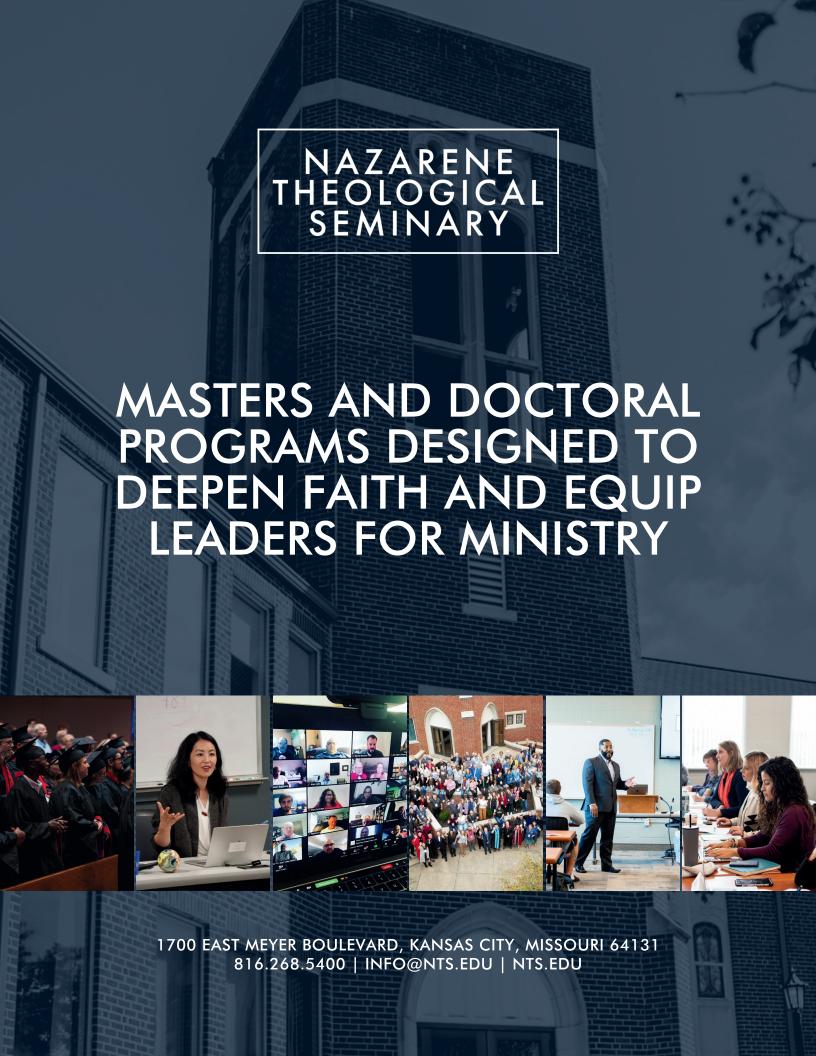

Presiding General Superintendent Dr. David Busic

Dr. David A. Busic was elected general superintendent in the Church of the Nazarene at the 28th General Assembly held in Indianapolis, Indiana, USA, in June 2013. At the time of his election, he had been president of Nazarene Theological Seminary since 2011.

Born in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, David was ordained in 1991 by Dr. John A. Knight. After being an associate pastor in Oklahoma and Kansas, he served as senior pastor for three Churches of the Nazarene: Vineyard Community Church (Livermore, California), Central Church (Lenexa, Kansas), and First Church (Bethany, Oklahoma). During his tenure at Bethany First, Dr. Busic helped initiate and establish the Swaziland Partnership in 2007 to help reduce the HIV/AIDS rate and assist vulnerable children in Eswatini (formerly Swaziland), Africa.

Dr. Busic received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Southern Nazarene University in 1988 and a Master of Divinity degree from Nazarene Theological Seminary in 1993. Southern Nazarene University conferred a Doctor of Divinity degree upon him in 2010. He earned a Doctor of Ministry in theology and culture at Fuller Theological Seminary.

He has a distinguished tradition of service to the denomination. He has been a member of the General Board of the Church of the Nazarene, during which time he was also elected president of the USA National Board. From 2005 to 2013 he was a member of the Board of General Superintendents' Thought Partners, a think tank for critical issues facing the church.

Busic was co-editor for Preacher's Magazine from 2000 to 2007. He has also published numerous articles, book chapters, and authored five books, *Perfectly Imperfect: Character Sketches from the Old Testament; Perfectly Imperfect, Character Sketches from the New Testament; The City: Urban Churches in the Wesleyan Tradition; Way, Truth, Life: Discipleship as a Journey of Grace; and his most recent volume, <i>The Praying Pastor: Learning to Lead from your Knees.* His preaching is widely respected throughout the church, making him a sought-after speaker and leadership advisor.

Dr. Busic and his wife, Christi, live in Edmond, Oklahoma. They have three grown children and seven grandchildren.

District Superintendent Dr. Virgil Askren

Dr. Virgil Askren and his wife Judy joined the Colorado District in July 2021. Previously, he served as District Superintendent of the South Arkansas District 2018-2021, senior pastor of Bend Church of the Nazarene in Bend, Oregon for 14+ years. He has a Doctor of Ministry from Western Seminary. Virgil enjoys CrossFit, hiking, and spending time with his Cairn Terrier, Tavish. The Askrens have two grown daughters and two wonderful sons-in-law.

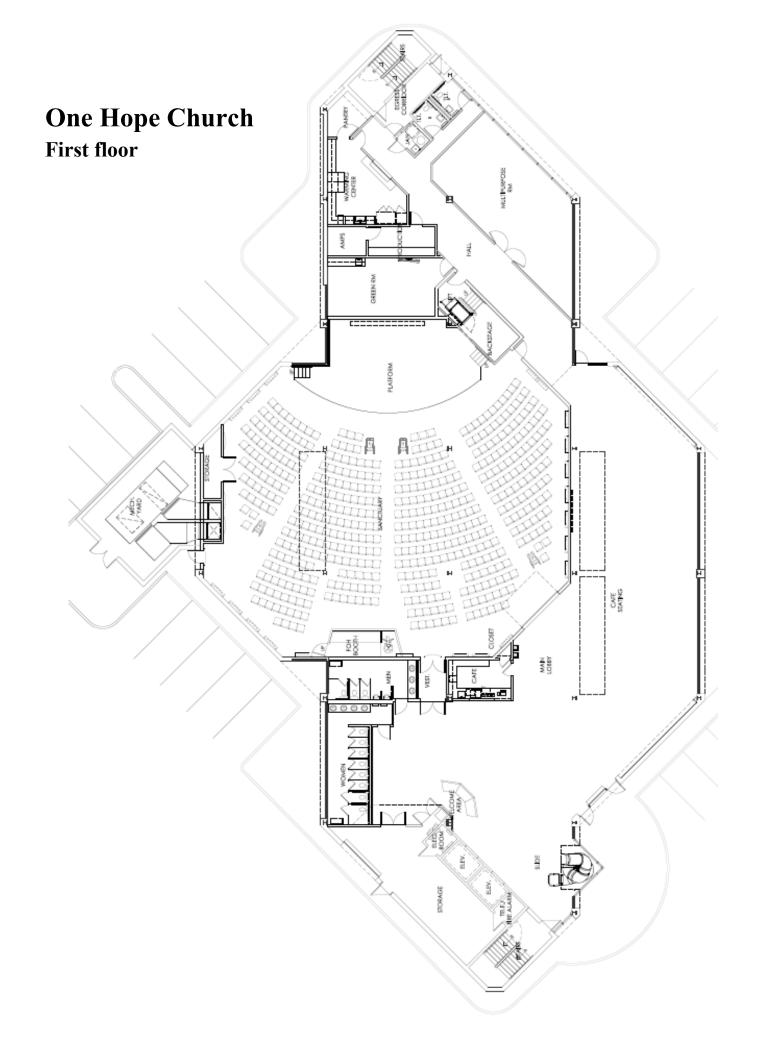

2025 Finance Committee Report and Recommendations to the Assembly

We believe in responsible Christian stewardship through the payment of evangelism funds. Every dollar invested in ministry funds by the local church declares loyalty and love to the mission and message of God's kingdom here on earth. Every church should plan carefully to meet this scriptural responsibility to God and His church in reaching lost, unevangelized men and women through the district and denominational funds. The love of Christ, moving and motivating us within and without, leaves no room for unwarranted failure in this area of stewardship.

Part I. Funding the Mission

District Ministries Fund (which includes Church Development / New Start, Ethnic, NDI, NMI and NYI), World Evangelism Fund, Nazarene Benefits Fund and Education Fund

We recommend:

- 1. That the District Ministries Fund be set at 3% of the Adjusted Income of the Annual Pastor's Report.
- 2. That the World Evangelism Fund for the Colorado District be set at 5.5% of the Adjusted Income of the Annual Pastor's Report.
- 3. That the Nazarene Benefits Fund be set at 2% of the Adjusted Income of the Annual Pastor's Report.
- 4. That the Educational Fund for Northwest Nazarene University be set at 2.5 % of the Adjusted Income of the Annual Pastor's Report.
- 5. That our people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to wills, annuities, and legacy gifts on behalf of the church.
- 6. That the above ministry funds be paid monthly based on the income for the previous month with the first payment due in June each year.
- 7. That each local church will have pay by the time of, or bring the estimated first monthly payment of the District Ministries Fund to the District Assembly.
- 8. That each church make full use of the Funding the Mission and Colorado District websites to expedite participation and track progress

Part II. To the Churches

The Finance Committee has endeavored to apportion the ministry funds in the most fair and equitable manner possible in the light of the evangelism fund base adopted by the General Board. We recommend:

- 1. That the allocation of missional funds be the percentages for the World Evangelism Fund, Educational Fund, and Nazarene Benefits Fund set by the General Board.
- 2. That the District assume responsibility for the encouragement of full payments of all missional funds by the local churches.
- 3. We strongly encourage all churches to participate in missional giving.
- 4. That the District Finance Committee provide a proposed budget to the District Advisory Board and District Assembly.

Part III. Insurance

We recommend:

- 1. That life insurance be provided by the district for all Senior Pastors of local churches meeting eligibility requirements, District Superintendent, Assistant District Superintendent, and Executive Director of Golden Bell.
- 2. That the local church consider offering disability insurance for their pastor in addition to that provided through payment of the Nazarene Benefits allocation.
- 3. Out of a deep concern for our clergy, a recommendation that churches carefully review the impact of current healthcare legislation and its effects on current policy, procedures and practices at the local church level surrounding coverages and assistance for pastoral staff and insurance premiums and deductibles. Additional resources are available from the General Church and resources such as Christianity Today's Church & Clergy Tax Guide, ECFA (Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability) and others.

Part IV. Operating Policies

We recommend that each local church include in its policies the following:

- 1. The local church treasurer will provide an annual financial report to the board and congregation to include all incoming and outgoing funds.
- 2. The church board reviews its handling of funds ensuring that one person does not handle both incoming and outgoing monies.
- 3. The church board determines/reviews annually access to confidential information on individual contributions and on church financial reporting.
- 4. The church board reviews accessibility to church computers, especially those connected to the internet.
- 5. The church board secures and safely, electronically stores for an indefinite time all insurance policies, all legal documents that are not stored elsewhere, and all background material.
- 6. We recommend that all churches maintain property, liability, and sexual misconduct coverage.
- 7. The church board submits at the first board meeting in the fiscal year approval of housing allowances for all paid staff, part-time or full-time, and included in that action paid ministry shall be allowed to reduce reportable income by all unreimbursed business expenses under current IRS accountable reimbursement guidelines. (*This should be reviewed/acted upon when any staff changes occur during the fiscal year.)

Part V. District Staff

We recommend:

- 1. That payment in full for health insurance be made for the District Superintendent, Assistant District Superintendent, and Golden Bell Executive Director and their immediate families in accordance with available funding through an approved operating budget.
- 2. That the District Superintendent and Assistant District Superintendent be reimbursed for their reasonable professional business expenses through an approved accountable

- reimbursement plan and in accordance with available funding through an approved operating budget.
- 3. That the District Superintendent and Assistant District Superintendent be reimbursed travel for the district at the current IRS approved mileage rate or other IRS allowable agreed upon financial arrangements and in accordance with available funding through an approved operating budget.
- 4. That the district consider paying a portion of medical reimbursements for the District Superintendent and Assistant District Superintendent immediate families in accordance with applicable laws and pending available funding through an approved operating budget.
- 5. That volunteers serving on district boards and committees be reimbursed travel for the district at a rate of \$.35 per mile in accordance with available funding through an approved operating budget. In some cases, this may cause a taxable event. Volunteers are encouraged to refer to the IRS website or consult a tax professional.

Part VI. Evangelists' Support

We recommend that local churches pay evangelists a prudent and generous provision for services rendered.

Part VII. Ministerial Support and Benevolence

That the financial support of pastors be given careful study and periodic review by the church board, giving consideration following the Department of Labor's index, being reviewed twice a year. An automatic cost-of-living adjustment should be considered in the fall of each year. In the spring, there should be a review based on merit and church progress.

- 1. That the pastoral remuneration comprises:
 - a. Fair and generous salary including the full amount of Social Security (based on pastor's salary, plus housing allowance and/or parsonage rental values),
 - b. Parsonage and/or housing allowance,
 - c. Utilities and parsonage expense,
 - d. Family health and life insurance premiums, insurance co-payments and/or deductibles (see III.2 and III.3 above),
 - e. Church related vehicle usage reimbursement or allowance,
 - f. Annuity allowance and/or other supplemental retirement programs,
 - g. Continuing Ministerial Education allowance, and,
 - h. Miscellaneous professional reimbursements for such things as books, entertainment, conventions, and conferences.
- 2. That pastors and all full-time ministerial staff members be given a minimum of two weeks paid vacation annually. We further recommend that all the above who have accumulated five or more years of salaried ministry be granted paid vacation as follows.
 - 5-10 years3 weeks
 - 10-15 years4 weeks
 - 15-20 years5 weeks
 - 20+ years6weeks

Churches should establish the accrual limit in accordance with all state and local regulations to provide clarity of that limit to the pastor and church. Accumulated years of salaried ministry shall include service in the Church of the Nazarene prior to that accumulated at the present assignment of the minister. This vacation time should be exclusive of time spent at district and general church meetings. The pastor is advised to use discretion and wisdom in the planning of vacation to best work with the church's needs and calendar.

3. That out of a deep concern for our pastors to avoid burnout and stress and to keep a clear continuing vision for their church and ministry:

That churches and the district consider giving a sabbatical or continuing professional development leave for their pastoral staff, in accordance with available funding through an approved operating budget, as early as during their seventh year of ministry. Special care should be deliberated to include accumulated years of salaried ministry comprising service years in the Church of the Nazarene prior to the accrued years in their current local church assignment. This leave should take into consideration, as finances allow, as being with pay and benefits, and could be from 4 - 12 weeks in length and would be in addition to regular vacation time with their family. This time would be used for rest, renewal, and study. This will aid pastors in finding new creative ways to help the church accomplish its ministry vision. A rested and refreshed pastor will help build even stronger relationships with their church. We strongly recommend that each church consider implementing a sabbatical policy.

- 4. That the district superintendent provides a communication channel to the local church board concerning ways that they can properly care for their pastor and family, considering present high costs of living.
- 5. That the local church pay expenses of the pastor's spouse when their professional responsibilities require out of town trips.
- 6. That this entire report, with Part VII highlighted, be distributed annually to the local Church Board Secretary by the end of January.

Part VIII Support of District Sponsored Ministries

That local churches be encouraged to support through financial offerings and gifts, prayer and encouragement to Colorado Nazarene Compassion Ministries (Food for Hope, Jesus of Nazareth, Movement 5280, Nazarene Disaster Relief, etc.), New Start / Church Development Ministries, and the Golden Bell Camp and Conference Center.

2025 District Advisory Board Report

The Advisory Board met six times this year. In those meetings business was conducted including review of monthly financial reports, transfer and receipt of credentials, oversight of the financial review, receiving reports on the status of churches, and oversight of the operations of Golden Bell.

SPECIFIC ACTIONS TAKEN:

Credentials - Recommended granting and renewal of a district minister's license for the following senior pastors: Ben Beckner, Eladio Chavez, JanElle Hoffman, Gildardo Prieto (local license), Colton Townley, Matthew Waggoner, and Jim Young. Approved requests for special service status for Jadalla Ghrayyeb, Tina Hayhurst, Cindy Johnson, Janine King, Alan Scott, and John Watkin. Approved the request for Song Evangelist Registered status for Jerry Nelson. A transfer of jurisdiction to the Florida District for the credential of Jason Daye was approved. Returning the credential of Allen Paris to active status was approved.

Properties and Loans – Colorado Springs Kingdom Rock Church was approved to borrow up to \$300,000.00 for building and property renovations. Security Life Community was approved, in cooperation with their lender, to skip the August 2024 payment on their mortgage loan while securing a new tenant. They were subsequently approved to lease a portion of their facility to Victory Worship of the Rockies. Denver Family Church was approved to allow the private school renting a portion of their facility to develop a new outdoor play area. A DAB loan of up to \$100,000 to the Yuma Church was approved, to be repaid from insurance funds and returned contractor fees.

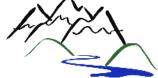

The Golden Church was approved to sell a portion of their unused property and was subsequently approved to sell the entire campus. Brighton Chapel Hill Church was approved to enter a period of interest-only payments on their mortgage. A Mountaintop Experience

Greetings from Golden Bell. I am excited to share all that God has been doing and how He has protected the camp throughout the year. We are grateful for the many who have come alongside Golden Bell as we have faced trials and times of concern. However, our God is greater, and we are thankful for His presence and provision.

As many know, this past October, a neighbor in our area purposely started a fire in their own house. This fire quickly made its way onto Golden Bell property. It spread fast from the southwest side of the property to the northeast. The greatest damage occurred in the first 48 hours. The fire continued to burn for over a week. The fire was ultimately brought under control when we received un-forecasted snow. We are grateful for the prayers of so many and the hard work of over 200 firefighters. I cannot express our thanks enough for their tireless service. Shortly after the fire, the call went out to our District family to help Golden Bell with financial support for fire recovery. So many churches and individuals responded, sending over \$13,000 in support. Thank you for your generosity during this time. God used you to bring us such a blessing.

In the spring of 2024, we were undergoing our annual adventure course inspections where it was discovered that a woodpecker had made a hole in the top of one of the main poles for our 900 ft zipline, resulting in catastrophic failure for the entire zipline element and 4 elements that were attached to it. This was a great loss to the camp. However, we are excited to announce that a generous foundation has stepped in and provided a donation to rebuild the Zipline element. Preparation for this project is underway, and the new double zipline will be completed by the end of this summer.

Golden Bell's blessings continued when the Colorado District Advisory Board voted to give two grants. One to pay off our land debt and a second one to upgrade security cameras throughout the camp. Over the years the DAB has been helpful in so many ways to assist in the health of camp ministry. Thank you, Dr. Askren, Dr. Compton, and the members of the District Advisory Board for your continued support.

Throughout this year, our Leadership Team has focused on developing our Mission and Vision, improving outcomes by impacting staff goal setting and employee training. We are concentrating on the building blocks of Discipleship, Leadership, and Service. Golden Bell rises beyond these building blocks when others join us in vital roles as Prayer Partners, Volunteers, and Donors. We are excited about our future.

This summer, Golden Bell Camp has the largest number of Summer Staff since pre-COVID. Our Programming staff worked hard and has done an amazing job of following up and hiring well-qualified staff for summer ministry. We are honored to be witnesses of God's amazing plans for each or their lives as they serve with Golden Bell.

This is my 6th report to the Colorado District Assembly. My wife, Olivia, and I are thankful for the opportunity to serve as part of the team. We are blessed to be a part of what God is accomplishing at Golden Bell, and we could not do it without the partnership of great District churches and loving people. We continue to work diligently for the kingdom to see lives transformed.

Dear Dr. Busic, Dr. Askren, Local NMI Presidents, Delegates and Friends of NMI:

This is my second report as District President of the Colorado Nazarene Missions International (NMI), but first full year completed as NMI President. I would like to highlight a few of the things that the Colorado NMI has done over the past year.

Last year in January of 2024, we had our first ever NMI District Council retreat with Dr. Askren. We had a wonderful time of fun, (Dr. Askren is very competitive in case you didn't know!) and brainstormed on how we can make NMI more visible and engaging. That is how we came up with the Reigniting/Reinvigorating NMI. We intend to carry that on this year as we will start focusing on individual areas of NMI over the next few years.

A few highlights from this year:

- **↓** The council approved to purchase a generator on 12/14/2024 for \$2,500 for the work at the border in Ukraine that Rev. Bob and Linda Skinner are involved with.
- We also approved a donation of \$6,000 on 2/4/2025 to Movement 5280 in an urgent need that they had (see below).
 - (From Movement 5280):

Financial Challenges and Immediate Needs

While we remain deeply committed to this mission, we are facing significant financial challenges. Some of these stem from our expanded reach, while others result from broader trends, including a decline in local church support as many congregations face their own financial dificulties.

We urgently need \$15,000 this month and an additional \$10,000 per month through April to sustain our operations and provide these vital services.

Steps We've Taken to Manage Resources:

We are committed to being good stewards of our resources and have implemented several cost-saving measures, including:

Selling two shuttles to reduce expenses.

Reducing stafing costs.

Beginning Medicaid billing in October 2024, currently generating \$6,000 per month, with expectations to double by April 2025.

Consolidating programs, such as moving Friday services to once a month and replacing them with billable, purposeful classes.

Staf members personally contribute and volunteer additional hours.

Despite these eforts, securing grants has become increasingly dificult, and we are at a critical juncture where we cannot continue without additional support.

♣ The Eastborough Nazarene Church and Palisade Nazarene Church partnered together and took a Missions trip to Peru. On July 28th, 2024, I had the pleasure of visiting Palisade church the morning the team gave their presentation to the congregation of their trip. I was proud to be a part of this presentation and to see how God used both churches on this trip.

On August 2-3, 2024, the Colorado District Missions team made up of twenty folks (20) mobilized to Yuma First Church of the Nazarene to partner with them in preparing for their Vision to reach Yuma Children and Families through a Children's playground. The team helped prepare the foundation for the tile as well as placing a chain link fence around the perimeter of the play area.

On October 25th and 26th, 2024, the Nazarene Mission Team put together a work weekend at Movement 5280, our Nazarene Compassionate Ministry Center to help with projects that they needed done. We had churches from all over the district bring teams to help with this weekend project. There were a total of about forty-five(45) people who came to help. What an amazing District we have!

- On December 4-7, 2024, we did our annual trip to Gallup, NM for our Christmas project. We had thirty- two people attend from the Colorado district this year to help unload the trailer, stage the area for the next day's distribution to our Native American friends. We had a church service with our Colorado team and our Native American friends, which was in Navajo and English. After service, they served us lunch and we did the distribution of food stufs and Christmas gifts. We have eighteen (18) churches on the Southwest Native American District that we distribute to. God is Good!
- On March 15th, 2025, Eastborough Church hosted Rev. Bob and Colleen Skinner, former missionaries, current District Superintendent at Rocky Mountain District do two (2) workshops, Making THE Mission, my Mission and Lessons from Abroad that apply here at home. This was open to all churches on the District. They had twenty seven (27) people in attendance.
- 4 On April 3rd, 2025, I, along with a couple of other council members, pastors and Dr. Compton had the privilege of having dinner with Kevin Ulmet, Pastor at Nashville First Church of the Nazarene and Founder and President of the African Nazarene University Foundation. He shared with us the work that they are doing at ANU and how the Lord has blessed them even through and after Covid. Right now they have about 1,200 students registered at the University.
- ◆ On May 17th, 2025, the council, along with some of the other churches attended the Grace and Life Ministries Fundraiser Fiesta Dinner "Precious in His Sight". All proceeds will be invested in our children and youth programs.
- **↓** Care and Connection (previously LINKS): Our Care and Connection Missionary for Colorado is Heidi Bowes from Eurasia.
- ♣ Deputations: The district helped twelve (12) missionaries book deputation services in Colorado.

2025 District NYI Report

As we conclude an incredible year of ministry together, I want to express my deep gratitude for the privilege of serving as the NYI President for the Colorado District. This is my first report as the NYI President to this Assembly. This year has been marked by growth, teamwork, transition, and spiritual momentum as we continue to build on the legacy of leadership and faith that has come before us.



This year has brought leadership changes, we once again elected a new NYI President. We have seen some of our leaders move away, some of our leaders change roles, and some of our leaders move on to different things. While transitions are never easy, the resilience and dedication of our team shone through. We have welcomed new leaders into the fold, and we continue to seek more voices to join us in this ministry. We would love to have many more of you join us to help grow and strengthen our NYI Council, and to see many more students come to a new or deeper relationship with God.

The theme of **teamwork** has been central to the NYI Council this past year. Scriptures such as John 17:20-23 and Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 have reminded us that we are stronger together. Our success relies on our unity in Christ and each other. We have been focused on being like the disciples, working together to help the Colorado students know that Jesus loves them and that He desires to have a relationship with each of them.

from being able to attend. The Holy Spirit was present and moved all weekend. We had a lot of people come together to be able to pull off this weekend.

- Main Event (March) 2025: We saw a strong increase in participation. There were 200 people in attendance this year. The success was the result of collaboration between our seasoned and new leaders—highlighting the strength of our team-based approach. The weekend was focused on Bringing People to Jesus through the unique talents that God has provided. During our three worship services we heard the Word of God preached and capped off the weekend once again with a powerful s student led service.

Our continued vision statement is to work with Jesus in helping to "Transform Aurora One Life at a Time"!! We set out like every other church to just bless people in our community. One of our key ideas was to have Spanish as a second language. We thought, what if a dozen to 20 people could carry on a hallway conversation with our Hispanic guests? What would that change for us? So, we had these classes and over 25 people attended. We came out of that with the vision to possibly start a Spanish speaking SS class.

Sometimes a seed has to be planted, and you have to allow it to grow. Early in April a Mom and her two teenage daughters walked to church from the new apartments just north of our church. The Mom speaks very little English; the daughters are bilingual. They have come now for 5 Sundays, and the girls come to youth group. They have only been in a church 3-4 times and they like this church because "nothing is forced on them." They volunteered for our Easter Egg Hunt outreach event. And the older daughter helped us come up with a Mother's Day gift and led the teens in knowing how to make them. On Mother's Day their Dad came to church! Blessing our community is now turning into distinct opportunities to Bring People to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ.

We keep track of the names of visitors that come to our church. This past church year we saw 68 visitors.....there were a few more, but 68 is the number of names we received. At least 36 of them are still coming at least once a month.

We believe that this coming year is going to be a harvest of bringing people to Jesus that was started with the idea of blessing our community.

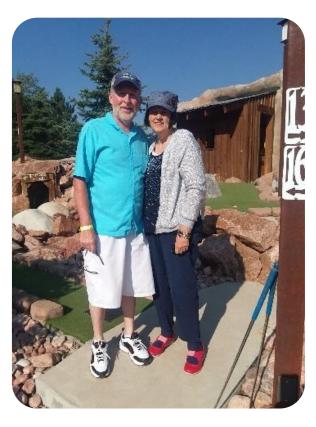

In 2024 Eastborough Church of the Nazarene blessed our community with Wednesday Night Alive, a free meal at 5:30 followed by Bible Studies, which brought a number of community kids and teens through our doors. Some of them have given their lives to Christ! At Christmas we gave clothing to 21 children at Roosevelt Elementary, the school across the street. This was in addition to clothing we gave to 16 children and teens from the congregation who live close by, many of whose parents do not attend the church. Our Fall Fun Fest provided a safe environment where families could play games, get candy, receive door prizes and hear the Gospel in creative ways. 450 community members attended, aside from 57 volunteers from our congregation. 2025 kicked off with a Teen Lock-In with 23 kids in attendance with an evangelistic message from Pastor Bailey Arnold. Our Easter Eggstravaganza gave children the opportunity to hunt for 8000 eggs, but only after they and their families heard the Good News at craft stations presenting Christ's story at the Last Supper, in Gethsemane, at the Cross and through the empty tomb. Our 51 volunteers hosted and shared the Gospel with 150 children and their families that day. We also hosted 87 at our Easter breakfast where Pastor Jim shared the Good News and gave an invitation to conversion. We thank God for these opportunities to bring people to Jesus. Nathan came to Eastborough wondering whether he would be treated kindly by our teens. He was embraced, mostly because the teen leadership council, composed of 5 teens, Pastor Bailey, and Dusty Stevens (an adult sponsor), had recently decided they had to do better welcoming newcomers with love and kindness. Last November Nathan was baptized and his grandfather read his testimony. He has grown in Christian conviction, is continually ready to serve (even running our sound system), has developed leadership skills and is now a member of the teen leadership council himself. We thank God for the fruit of evangelism that He has given us in Nathan!

These words have become my mantra when I need to be reminded of what I need to do. Genesis Church is excited about what God is getting ready to do. We've loved on so many people, planted so many seeds (faith believing they fell on good soil). 1 Corinthians 3:6-8 ⁶ I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the increase. ⁷ So then neither he who plants is anything, nor he who waters, but God who gives the increase. ⁸ Now he who plants and he

who waters are one, and each one will receive his own reward according to his own labor. A story, we prayed and suffered alongside two people this year. We prayed for others, but these two particular people are an answer to prayer. Person #1, backslide to the place of their life spiraling out of control with drugs and bringing homeless people to his home which caused a number of problems. This situation grew so out of control that the police had to be called, and this person was arrested. While in jail for over 3 months, he talked about the people he was in jail with and how he knew he had to change his life around. He knew when he got out of jail, he would be on probation, go to a sober home and get back in church. It's been several months since he's been out and has made a significant difference to those who saw him several months prior. What a change... No desire to do drugs again and couldn't believe the choices he made. God added the increase. Yes, he is on the right track but it's a different journey now. Thanks to the Lord.

Person #2. Hurt, neglected, taken advantage of, beat up, life spiraled out of control. This person would always say, "I don't want to go to hell". Constantly saying that. We encouraged her by scripture as we loved her and showed her tough love at the same time. After 90 days in a sober home this past year. She has renewed her faith and now able to sing again and grow in the grace of God.

In the meantime, we pass out cards, and books of John making connections with the community and people we come across during the day. This summer we are planning prayer walks and canvassing areas by passing out literature and cards wherever we go. Kids are included. This is our heartbeat. Our kids sang in a community choir for MLK breakfast in January at the Antler's hotel. Their picture was posted in the Gazette newspaper.

The leadership is finishing up the People of Grace. Starting BLESS and will implement any changes as necessary to win soul for Christ.

This past year was an unusual year for us as we really thought we would be in our own facility by now. We are still waiting on God's opportunity and timing. Yet, that did not keep us from achieving some amazing things. We blessed our community over and over again, celebrated our 20th anniversary, raised \$50,000 for a future facility, and even added a community with the launching of our Downtown Campus. The impact our little community center, The LIFE Center, is having on our community, and our church, is simply amazing! Pastor Drew Romero is our LC Director, and under his leadership we gave away 152 tons of food in 2024, averaging 158 visitors to our pantry every week, and providing food for nearly 28,000 people. In addition, we added 26 new people to True Life through the LIFE Center. The LC has become the primary "front door" of our church. In fact, two of our recently elected board members first came to TLCC through the LC! This past year we began partnering with Celebrate Recovery and every Friday Pastor Darrell Smith takes a group to participate and lives are being changed. We are watching lives be transformed again and again. Many that we meet come to us with a kind of "folk theology" that includes a hodgepodge of beliefs about God. People want to know God but they are gathering information from everywhere but the Church. We are cutting through this by valuing and befriending folks, accepting them right where they are, meeting their needs, and then gently and slowly introducing the God of the Bible and truth. I am so blessed to be joined in this endeavor by a team that also includes Pastor Pam Jantz (women's min & soul care), Keenan Morgan (youth), and Grace Williams (worship), along with a congregation that gets it! Pastor Garry McGlinchy is following the same model at our Downtown Campus and beginning to see people added to their congregation through their food giveaways and loving their community.

"How big IS your church?!" the fellow volunteer asked me after she saw all the items we had donated and all the people who had shown up to help at a community event. "We're a family of about 50," I told her. A family with a big heart. A family who has embraced the vision of blessing our community. In 2024 with the help of several grants including one from our district, we created "Jim's Place," a safe, fun backyard space to better serve our Mamas & Littles group as well as the four scout groups we host. Our youth packed emergency cold weather kits for our unsheltered neighbors, we made and served soup one Sunday as worship, we have written encouraging cards to teachers and first responders - we have loved our little city with the enormous love of Christ. As our "CNaz" family considers how to build on the foundation of blessing the community, we have concluded that the best way for us to bring people to Jesus is to bring Jesus to people. CNaz is prayerfully looking for ways to BE the church around others; to go to people with the gospel. One way we have done so is adopting "The Gathering Place" as an extension of our church. The Gathering Place is a simple coffee-shop setup where friendship evangelism happens on a daily basis. For example, *Brian* came into the Gathering Place while one of our CNaz family was there to volunteer. "I'm so lost," he eventually declared in the course of the conversation. The volunteer was able to explain the gospel and Brian prayed to trust Jesus for salvation and the direction of this life. He started coming to our church. We were able to help with his job hunt and eventually help him to relocate to be near family. God willing, *Brian's* story will be one of many as we partner with the Lord, by the power of the Spirit, to preach, live, give, love, embody the gospel in our Cortez community.

A genuine hug from a man from Guatemala made him shyly lower his head and begin to cry, which deeply moved us. He wasn't sad; he simply said, "I needed a hug," and stayed, never to leave. What can we say? We will do whatever brings joy to our blessed God's heart here at Denver Family Church.

On April 20, 2025, ThornCreek Church turned 22 years old. It started in my living room with three complete strangers. God can use anyone! Glory to God!



How has ThornCreek blessed our community? ThornCreek started a backpack food program called Food For Hope (FFH) in 2014. It's a backpack program that partners with schools. It has grown significantly. This last year, FFH fed 1,500 people every week. We are in over 30 public schools. It also operates four grocery stores within four schools. In partnership with FFH, ThornCreek also does our annual FEED 5000 event every November. Last Thanksgiving

season, we fed almost 10,000 people a full Thanksgiving meal. Every September we also have "Hope Week". During Hope Week we partner with organizations for five consecutive days. It's an exhausting week, but fulfilling! Additionally, we do one outreach project every month, with one of our year-long ministry partners: Hope House (Serves Teen Moms); Beyond Home (Helps Families become self-sufficient); Urban Farm (Serves urban youth through agriculture); Synergy Village (Helps families that have experienced setbacks); Re-Fined (Ministers to survivors of sexual exploitation); Growing Home (Ensures the equity in food, housing, parenting education); Save Our Youth (A mentoring program for teenagers); and Foster Source (Ministers to foster families). We also continue to partner with Compassion International, and sponsor almost 100 children through a Nazarene Church in Negritos, Peru.

How are we bringing people to Jesus? Well... This is ThornCreek. All our worship services are purposefully designed by our Creative Team to engage the unchurched and introduce them to Jesus. Every sermon is culturally relevant, raw, and ends with an invitation to know Jesus. We highlight a God-story every weekend. Our worship is passionate, Spirit-driven. Everything is about Jesus. What's the fruit of this intentionality? We have had more than 200 conversions, and we had 90 baptisms in the year. On Easter weekend, we had 65 baptisms! Praise Jesus! We also disciple people using a program called, "SmallCircle", and through our small groups.

What's a God-story from ThornCreek? Lots of God-stories. We have several types of people that come to ThornCreek, including gay couples. One of our gay couples, who weren't Christians, approached me after a Saturday night service and told me that they had been praying. They have been in a romantic relationship for four years. But, after attending ThornCreek, and sensing a stirring from God's Holy Spirit, they have made a decision to not be in a romantic relationship any longer. They will continue to be friends in a platonic relationship. They were moving out from the bedroom they shared and will now be in two separate rooms. They also said they would be announcing this decision to their family. They attend church every weekend...literally. All three services, every weekend. Jesus is still changing lives!

After being led by the Holy Spirit to Faith Community Church, asking God what His purpose was for my life, I knew there was something more. Pastor Rick has given me this incredible opportunity to lead a Bible Study and has helped guide me in ensuring the right doctrines are being taught. All of this happened because I listened. I was obedient and followed God where he was leading me. I knew from the beginning that Pastor Rick was my mentor, and that God put me under his wing for a reason."

How are you working to bring people to Jesus in 2025? This year, I shared with the church board a book delivered to me from the District office. It was a required reading for pastors and a recommendation to share with the board. This is in hopes that we can prayerfully adopt the *B.L.E.S.S.* framework by Dave and Jon Ferguson as our church's discipleship rhythm and missional strategy for this coming year. As a growing church, our desire is to thrive in both number and God's power. We are asking the Holy Spirit to lead us with vision, boldness, and humility as we step into the new ministry year. Our goals are both tangible and spiritual—and rooted in the mission of Christ. So, we are going to be—praying, listening, eating, serving, and sharing. We will *B.L.E.S.S.* Durango. You've heard the question before — a kind of gut-check for the Church. *If our church were to close its doors, would our community notice?*

Of course, those of us who gather here each Sunday would notice. Our congregation, our neighbors across the street, maybe a few who walk their dogs past our building. But would the wider community feel the absence?

Like many churches, Emmaus Road has had long stretches of quiet in recent years. Aside from the stirrings of small groups and the occasional rehearsal or meeting, the building was mostly still. It was easy to wonder if our presence stretched beyond our own circle.

But in 2024, we began to pray — alongside many of you — for new ways to open our lives and our church to the community around us. We asked the Spirit to stir us, challenge us, and make space for connection. And the Spirit answered.

Without any flashy initiative or campaign, we found ourselves hosting three different recovery groups who were looking for a stable and welcoming place to meet. Now, Emmaus is home to daily 12-Step meetings — sometimes multiple meetings a day — providing a healing space for more than 140 people on the path of recovery.

I've come to know Nic Bossard, a leader in the local Narcotics Anonymous community. Over lunch recently, Nic shared his gratitude for what Emmaus is providing. He said, "Every time we meet, there are new faces. These are people choosing to gather in community instead of getting high. They're carrying pain and struggle, but they're choosing life. We are literally saving lives every time we meet."

Sometimes, when the Gardener prunes, it is so our branches will bear fruit. But sometimes, we are trimmed simply to become strong enough to hold a life-bearing nest for others — to become a host for the new life God is nurturing through them.

If Emmaus closed its doors in 2025, our community would notice. Our prayer is that the Holy Spirit would continue to heal, restore, and breathe life into the hundreds of new friends who've found a place to belong here.

At Falcon Community, this past year has been one of transition, trust, and fresh beginnings. In October, our family moved from the Philadelphia District to Falcon—responding to a calling, not just to lead, but to walk alongside a church with a heart for its people and its place. From the very beginning, we sensed a shared conviction rising among us: that God is calling us not just to gather inside the church, but to go out and be the Church. Not just to build attendance, but to bless the community around us. Through each step,

we've been learning that outreach isn't about plans or performance—it's about presence. And presence isn't a task; it's a privilege. Falcon Fest was one of the first moments where we lived that conviction out together. Armed with graham crackers, chocolate, and marshmallows, we handed out over 200 free s'mores to families from all over our community. But more important than what we gave was what we received: conversations that mattered, connections that lingered, and a surprising depth of sacred trust. We didn't just see adults coming forward—we watched children and teens approach our prayer wall, write out honest requests, and ask for prayer with sincerity and hope. It was humbling. It reminded us that people are searching. And sometimes, all it takes is showing up—being available, being present—for hearts to open. Yes, it requires vulnerability. But this is the kind of vulnerability that love demands: a willingness to step out, listen well, and let people know they're not alone. Falcon Fest wasn't about getting people into our doors. It was about getting us out of them. It was about learning to live out the gospel in a way that is relational, not just invitational. That experience has helped shape our vision for 2025: New Life, New Beginning... FLOURISH! We believe that flourishing begins with surrender, is nourished by renewal, and is sustained through community. And as we walk into this new season, we are praying and preparing for more relational evangelism opportunities—places where we can be present, plant seeds of hope, and trust God to bring the growth. The Cycle of Resurgence has reminded us that revival isn't always loud. Sometimes it starts with a s'more, a prayer, and a relationship built one step at a time. Turns out, the Spirit moves just fine over sticky fingers and simple faith.

Florence Faith Journey Pastor Colleen McMordie

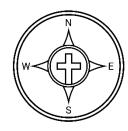

Morgan Church of the Nazarene seeks to bless our community. In the summer of 2024, we ministered in a manufactured-home community in our town for several weeks. We had crafts, games, and activities for children, as well as free clothes, shoes, and other items for adults. We did not have a VBS at our church but did a 3-day

Bible camp in that community. Most of that community is Spanish speaking. By the grace of God, through 4 years of ministering in that community and making connections, we were able to launch a Spanish worship service in September, and the leader of our Spanish ministries came from that community outreach. As a result of the Spanish service, several people have made new or renewed commitments to Jesus and have found a loving family.

One exciting example of a renewed commitment to Jesus is a man named Sergio. Sergio is a single dad working multiple jobs to provide for his kids. His kids had been participating in our midweek activities for children and youth for a year and a half, but Sergio had never come to church. One Sunday last summer his daughter was to sing in the praise team at church, so Sergio came. On that particular Sunday, I was sharing about the doors God was opening to new ministries and new possibilities through our community outreach. After church that day, Sergio told me that he hadn't been in church for 20 years, but God spoke to his heart that day, and if we were going to start a Spanish ministry, he wanted to be part of it. Sergio only made it to church one other time that summer, but again, felt God pulling on his heart when he was here. By the grace of God, Sergio came to the Launch of our Spanish worship service in September. At that service, he recommitted his life to Jesus. He has become a vital part of the ministry as a translator, participant in the worship band, and just through the power of a living testimony to the grace of God. He plays in the band now for both English and Spanish services and is actively inviting others to come experience the grace of God like he has.

We don't ever know how many we will see come to Jesus, but every Faith Promise we also promise to pray for a certain number of people we already know and those we don't yet know to come to Jesus. This last year we had a number of 124 people. I don't know what the actual number will be promised this September during Faith Promise but we do know that we just have to keep loving, blessing and when the doors open because of it, we can and will share with them about a life changing friend we have encountered in our own lives, Jesus!

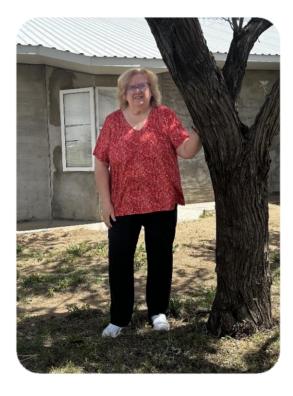
Greeley FirstPastor Charles Hayes

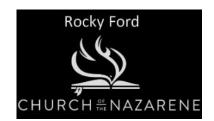

Our Rocky Ford Church congregation has experienced an intimate, communing spiritual growth in discipleship by focusing on the power of prayer and communion with the Father, the Life of Christ, and the sanctifying power of the Spirit.

We have sought to bless our community through practical, healing, and compassionate ministry. First, we bless our community with a few congregants who volunteer in providing meals and food boxes to those in need of extra assistance through a local Food Kitchen and the Rocky Ford Food Share Project. This Project often provides our church with excess foodstuffs to hand out throughout the month. Second, a few congregants assist in local addiction and recovery programs which focus on substance abuse and crisis centers. Third, a few congregants provide local ride share assistance in programs for vets and low-income patients. Fourth, one member takes Celebrate Recovery into prisons, providing redemptive hope in Christ. Fifth, for over six years, our church has sponsored its own Celebrate Recovery group which has been instrumental in providing conversions to Christ, baptisms, and new additions to church membership.

This year, our church experienced 13 conversions to Christ, 5 new disciples baptized, and 6 new members. In the last nine reports, Rocky Ford membership has included four years of 20%+ growth and 3 years of at least 9% growth, including 10% this year.

One father was on the precipice of losing his family because of his alcohol addiction, severe depression, and struggle sustaining his marriage relationship. After recommitting his discipleship journey with Christ, which included CR, he experienced a transformative, life-altering encounter with God and His sustaining, sanctifying grace. His family has been restored and is more whole and healthier than ever before. Even his little son often helps begin our worship services by sounding a small shofar! This is why the Rocky Ford Church proclaims the saving, sanctifying, and sustaining power of God's love – all to usher us into a deep, intimate, abiding, communing fellowship with Him!

This year, we desire to dig deeper into the BLESS outreach concept, enabling our people to present the life, salvation, and blessings of Christ Jesus by drawing our friends, families, and neighborhoods into God's Kingdom by His love! As Christ, we will seek to bring change to our part of the world through the transformative gift of BLESSing others.

Hope Hacienda is privileged to have people from many different and diverse backgrounds. The ages span the spectrum and are from varying backgrounds and tax brackets. While we're not breaking any attendance records, and our core group of regular attendees is quite small, we are united and accomplish some great things in our midst. We continue to minister to the Annual Navajo Nation project, and serve at the annual Movement 5280 workday. This year, for the first time, we started accumulating and preparing distribution boxes of Crisis Care Kits. For our immediate community we do have compassion funding available to minister to those experiencing some temporary financial struggles by providing food, paying an electric bill, or a portion of their rent for the month. This ministry doesn't always reap the numerical rewards of filling seats in our church, it definitely spreads the Word of God into the lives of those ministered to. Just over the last month, the men all came together to meet at a senior person in the community to tear down a shed and remove a fallen tree in the backyard. Many hands made short work of the project and those who helped, plus the unchurched senior were blessed by the service.

The single most impactful thing that has impacted me personally, is a story about a young unwed mother that contacted someone in our church. With permission to share her story, I proceed. She had recently discovered that she was pregnant again. Knowing how hard the first child was to take care of, she was unable to see a way forward and was going to terminate the pregnancy. With counsel, and the assurance that our church would be there for her and help her every step of the way, she felt touched by God and agreed to have the child. That beautiful little girl was born early this year and is doing well. Glory to God!! We're thrilled to say, "Hope Hacienda made a difference in that precious life!

This year has been the most challenging year of our

challenging year of our ministry to date: yet it has also been our most fruitful. On May 20th a relentless 100-year storm hit Yuma. Most of the church building had to be mitigated down to bare studs.

The damage was not limited to the building alone; the hearts of our people and the community were broken as well.

We made the horrible mistake of signing with a contractor that not only took the church for a significant amount of money, they advised us to sign with other companies that took us for more and delivered less. Our huge deductible and crooked contractors left Yuma Naz with over a quarter million-dollar deficit to overcome.

Thank the Living God our story does not end there. 1 Peter 5:10 And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast. With the help of great contractors, donated labor from the district's work and witness team, the stained-glass company, material sold at cost, the generosity of our folks and the help of this great district, we can now finish the construction with a mere \$45,000 (not \$265,000). We will make it through this storm without borrowing a dime. We had countless reasons to report significant decreases in every aspect of ministry. What Satan intended for evil God in His grace has used it for our good and His glory. The increases include:

- Our average attendance increased from 47 to 56.
- We baptized 6 folks, dedicated 2 babies and had 21 folks accept Jesus as their Savior.
- Our youth group average attendance increased to 32 teens. They have over 20 sponsors and teens signed up for NYC, sent 25 to Main Event, 35 to the Faith Day at the Rockies, 120 attended our local Friendsgiving event and over 90 our Christmas Night of Worship. Praise the Lord, our youth group has gone from zero to hero!
- Our Kingdom Kids After School Club average attendance increased to 25 kids.
- We have not had a VBS in years. This summer we are expecting well over 150 kids.
- Our total giving increased from about \$162,000 last year to well over \$184,000.

This year Yuma Naz was able to *Bless Our Community* by hosting other local churches who were under construction. In spite of the storm, we blessed our community with a new Kingdom Kids Program and a playground. While everyone else were forced to cut programing, we increased it. Many of our people helped with boarding windows and clean up in our neighborhoods. Yuma Naz was indeed blessed to fulfill the role as a wounded healer to our community.

"Partnering with Parachurch to Bring More College Students to Jesus"

Chris Bean has been in youth and college ministry for over 30 years, working mainly through NYI. For the past 4 years, he has been working with InterVarsity Christian fellowship to help churches collaborate with parachurch to reach college students for Christ. Participants will learn how to identify potential partners, build relationships, and develop strategic plans to engage students and foster spiritual growth. Out of the 58 college campuses in Colorado, 29 of them have No Known Ministries active on campus. We can change that together!

Oikos – Rev. David Ralph - Rm 302

OIKOS/OUTWARD FOCUS; How can we, the laity, move our relational world toward the church and the gospel in our "daily goings" Mt 10:7. Oikos is a biblical word for "household". The N.T. uses it for our relationships, friends and extended connections. God has "strategically & providentially" placed from 8 to 15 people in every believer's life. The longstanding obstacle for the church is to have tools and mechanisms to get out of the 4 walls in incremental ways to detect and move our OIKOS in baby steps toward Christ & His church. This is a pre-evangelism technique to move the church 1 degree toward their outward connections without conflict or confrontation in our daily routine; "As you go make your OIKOS aware of me!" This is what Jesus challenged Zaccheaus to do with all his rowdy friends. This simplifies the Great Commission in "do-able" bite size increments that any laymen or pastor can do.

A workshop on how Outreach.com can help your church connect with your community using postcards, banners, invite kits, and digital tools. Whether you're planting or established, this session will give you simple, cost-effective ideas to promote events, increase visibility, and invite people into the life of your church.

 - How Alpha builds community and connection that strengthens the body of Christ.
 - And most importantly, how it becomes a tool for spiritual renewal—not just for newcomers, but for the whole church.

I'll share examples of how Alpha has helped churches just like ours grow in unity, outreach, and spiritual depth—and how it's not just a program, but a **movement of hospitality and Holy Spirit-led conversation**.

We'll close with a time of Q&A and prayer—for anyone feeling stirred to take a step of obedience, whether that's running Alpha, attending, or simply asking God, "What's next for me?"



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
